B.C.C. «B» TEAM VERSUS
ANTWERPEN C. C.

While the «A» team were playing in far
off Amsterdam the «B» team had a match
on with the Antwerp C.C. which is a team
composed entirely of Belgian lads.

It is a great pity that on account of the
players selected as reserves not turning up,
the home side could only field ten men; but
as the visitors had only managed to muster
the same number of players a ten aside match
took place.

E. R. Cuthbert, who skippered the side in
the absence of L.H.R. Plummer, the latter
having travelled to Amsterdam to help the
«A» team, lost the toss but the visitors
elected to put Brussels in first. F. W. de
Haan and G. Cunliffe opening. The former
playing a very careful game, and the latter
hitting out, these two soon put up the score
to 41 before Cunliffe was caught off Thys
with 30 to his credit. H. R. Pritchard went
in and out next, the first ball he received
presenting him with a duck. V.D.J. Saxon
then joined de Haan at the wicket and took
the score to 108 for 3 wickets after 100 mi-
nutes batting. Saxon scoring 24 of which 16
were singles. The visitors bowling was well
mastered and yet R.L. Serin could only gar-
ther 6 runs before being caught off Thys
at mid on and his brother Fred who follo-
wed him in was also dismissed for a similar
score. Our popular Hon. Treasurer then
went in and it was soon apparent that he
meant to stay in as long as he could. He
saw L.L. Serin bowled for 0, E.H. Hunyan
pile up a good 35 and E.R. Cuthbert «hit
outs» for 9, without being himself dismissed
for a total of 40.

Thus the B.C.C. sent in the Antwerp C.C.
with 209 to win.

H.R. Pritchard went on to bowl at the tent
end and in his third over had Van Riel
caught by F. Serin at long on, who, in so
doing, brought off a very fine catch. This
first wicket stand yielded 13 runs.

The wickets then fell rapidly and Cuthbert
gave everybody a chance of bowling. The
innings closed with the score at 53.

Thus with a lead of 155 on the first innings
B.C.C. sent the A.C.C. in again.

Apart from Van Riel (25) and Thys (21)
very few of the visitors scored, as many as
six of them being dismissed for 0.

The second innings closed with 52 on the board, the Brussels team thus winning by an innings and 103 runs.

All that is needed has been said of the batting of the home team. Of the bowling, in the 1st innings Pritchard took three wickets for 8 runs and L. J. Serin 2 for 0 and de Haan 1 for 0. In the second innings the wickets were taken by seven different bowlers.

The home fielding was good. No catch was missed. F.H. Serin holding 5 catches in all sorts of places on the field and taking three wickets, during the match showed up as the most brilliant fielder of the match.

All are looking forward again to the visit of these young men on the 25th inst. for the return match and it is a great pity that youths who are trying to spend the Great Game in their native country should have to rely on two or three matches a year to improve their fielding, all through not being able to secure a ground in Antwerp. They are very keen, some of them play a very straight bat and could develop into good players, a few can field but very few can throw in at the wicket. This is on account of their only being able to get net practice. Their captain Thys, and Anthonn are very useful bowlers, the former bowling as many as 37 overs during the above match.
